How to Apply

Applicants are advised to provide the following:

- A cover letter stating the position and location of interest eg: **Service – Orthopaedic Surgery, Bunbury Health Campus**
- A Curriculum vitae summarizing your experience and how you are able to meet the position requirements
- A statement addressing each of the selection criteria (Located in the Job Description Form JDF)
- Proof of Citizenship and Residency status
- Required if applicable – Evidence of English language skills registration standard, AMC certificate, AMC multiple choice questionnaire results.

Documents should be complete and ready to be attached prior to applying online.

The Role

These positions are suitable for enthusiastic applicants interested in improving their orthopaedic skills under direct supervision and for those interested in applying for a position in the Orthopaedic Training Program. The successful applicants will gain a minimum of 12 months quality orthopaedic experience working alongside 2 Orthopaedic Trainees and 6 Orthopaedic Consultant Surgeons.

Applicants must be eligible for registration with APHRA. Applicants with at least one previous year of Orthopaedic Registrar experience from Australia or a recognised competent authority country (United Kingdom, Canada, United States, New Zealand and Ireland) will be preferred.

The successful candidates will be responsible for the clinical care of patients under the supervision of senior medical staff including:

- attending to patients in order of medical urgency
- taking history of full medical examinations of new admissions and arranging appropriate investigations and assisting with medical procedures as required
- managing medical conditions according to acceptable clinical standards under supervision of consultants
- collaborating with other Medical, Nursing staff and multidisciplinary team members to facilitate patient management and communication with family, outside medical practitioners, and/or community services concerning patient management.
