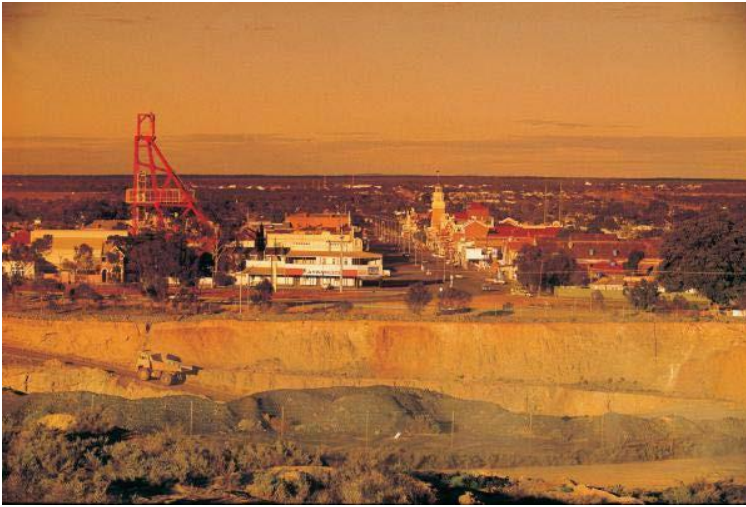




Rural Rotations in the Goldfields

Mother Nature is saluted each day in the Goldfields by a mesmerising sunset of unforgettable hues. As a junior doctor training in the region, you'll be part of a young and active medical crew working alongside senior clinicians. You will have plenty of opportunity to develop your procedural skills under supervision and after hours, enjoy the myriad of sporting and social events on offer.



For lovers of the great outdoors there is camping, dirt bike and motor-X riding, land sailing on the Salt Lakes and bush trails to explore in your downtime. The size and scale of the Super Pit unique to the goldfields, and is the biggest open cut gold mine in Australia.

Kalgoorlie Health Campus is the regional referral centre for the Goldfields region. The healthcare facility services a population in excess of 60,000 people, with an additional and significant transient (FIFO) community. There are 94 multi-day beds available, 18 same day bed/chairs and 7 beds available for Mental Health. Medical services provided include; Emergency Medicine, General Medicine, Orthopaedics, General Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Oncology, Paediatrics, Mental Health, Renal and a High Dependency Unit.

Positions at Kalgoorlie Health Campus

Kalgoorlie Health Campus supports accredited intern and resident medical officer term positions which provide the required experience, education and support for prevocational doctors who wish to gain rural experience. The campus is also a training site for workplace- based assessment (WBA) programs.

Kalgoorlie Health Campus Medical Education and Support

The Medical Education program at Kalgoorlie Health Campus is developed and led by the regional Director of Clinical Training (DCT) and coordinated by the Medical Education Officer (MEO). The DCT and MEO at Kalgoorlie Health Campus will support you during your rural placement with supervision provided by your clinical supervisor.

You can expect comprehensive education and training including; clinical supervision, regular education sessions, orientation and assessment support, simulation training, and a range of professional development programs. Each of the terms offers the junior doctors individualised learning opportunities in addition to a weekly education program which incorporates protected teaching time.

Rural Applications with WA Country Health Service (WACHS)

Intern Positions

Intern rotations for Kalgoorlie Health Campus are available through Royal Perth Hospital (RPH) for one or two terms.

Resident Medical Officer Positions (RMO)

WACHS is a direct employer of RMOs at Kalgoorlie Hospital through the Centralised Recruitment Process. Contracts of 6 – 12 months are available depending on position and department.

RMOs can also apply for rotations from Royal Perth Hospital to Kalgoorlie Health Campus on secondment for one or more terms.

Where to Apply

Applications for Intern and Resident Medical Officer rural placements are made via the Centralised Recruitment Process (<http://www.pmcwa.health.wa.gov.au/home>) and are based on merit. In your application, clearly state your interest in a rural placement and select your preferred region or site. Applicants are advised to keep abreast of application dates by checking the PMCWA website regularly.
