• The design development phase for the unit including the interior fit-out, fixtures, furniture and finishings is drawing to a close and we are now ready to have the unit costed by the Quantity Surveyor.

• The unit is situated on the Broome Hospital site so we are waiting for the existing laundry and kitchen to be demolished and resited before building can start.

• The landscape designer has drawn the first concept plan for the courtyards based on community ideas from our forums and group consultations.

• We are looking forward to an early 2009 start date for the build.

Community Forums


