What is the Allied Health Transition to Practice (T2P) program?

Our Allied Health T2P program supports graduates making the transition to rural and remote practice.

- One year supported program for graduates within the first two years of professional practice.
- Join the program at any time and from any WA Country Health Service location.
- Sessions run virtually.
- Professional and clinical supervision and skill development.

What will I get out of the T2P program?

- ✓ **Onboarding and work-shadowing**
- ✓ **Designated two hours per week to complete the T2P program**
 - Time set aside to complete components of the program and engage in further self-directed learning.
- ✓ **Individual learning plan**
- ✓ **Professional supervision:**
 - Access to a professional supervisor.
 - Regular 1:1 meetings.
- ✓ **Clinical skill development:**
 - Regular opportunities to meet with other graduates in your field, facilitated by the WA Country Health Service discipline lead.
 - Combination of professional learning, reflective practice, and opportunities for informal group discussions.
 - Access to professional development opportunities.
