The 1- The "Essentials of Rural Trauma Care" 1- day EMET Course, provides interprofessional, rural clinicians with solid knowledge, skills, and expertise to be able to manage critically ill trauma patients confidently and competently, many km's away from the state trauma centre.

Facilitated by a multi-disciplinary faculty with critical care and trauma backgrounds, participants will enjoy a mix of educational styles in the form of plenaries, skills workshops, small group discussions to brush up on the latest evidence in trauma care, learn and share tips and tricks from the experts as well as network with passionate, like-minded colleagues. High fidelity simulation sessions conclude the 1-day program, providing a rich opportunity to consolidate and celebrate one's knowledge and skills.

The workshop objectives include:

- Display a structured approach to the critically ill rural trauma patient and initiate simultaneous resuscitation.
- Revise & consolidate crucial trauma management principles pertaining to each aspect of the <C>ABCDE in trauma.
- Practice & enhance skills in essential trauma procedures such trauma airways, chest decompression, ICC, vascular access and auxiliary splints and binders.
- Understand and apply critical aspects in the management of haemorrhagic shock and neuroprotective resuscitation.
- Apply, practice, and consolidate acquired skills in high fidelity simulations throughout the course.

Eligibility: Interprofessional, rural medical practitioners, emergency department doctors and nurses, and

paramedics. Priority is given to those working in the local region.
