

Rural Trauma Team Resuscitation Course Karratha, 19 May 2024

The 1- day "Rural Trauma Team Resuscitation Course" aims to take rural trauma team education to the next level. The WA EMET Central Hub has partnered with the State Trauma Unit at RPH and the WA Trauma Training and Education Unit to bring this high fidelity, trauma masterclass to regional WA. Based on the successfully run Trauma Team Simulation Course (TTST) in metro, this course has specifically been designed to cater for the needs and challenges of rural trauma teams.

It is aimed at interprofessional, rural practitioners who want to excel their knowledge and skills when caring for critically ill and injured rural trauma patients. Aside from skills and knowledge this course focuses heavily on the human factor and non-technical aspects of trauma team resuscitation. Interactive small group discussions and workshops are facilitated by engaging and passionate multi-disciplinary expert faculty and high fidelity, immersive simulations provide an opportunity to consolidate the skills you will take back to your next trauma resus.

The workshop objectives include:

- Display a structured approach to the critically ill rural trauma patient, initiate simultaneous resuscitation and effectively lead the trauma resuscitation team.
- Review aspects of crisis resource and resus room management, initiate and maintain effective communication, identify barriers to a successful resuscitation and manage conflict situations.
- Recognise the unique clinical challenges in the assessment & management of trauma in special populations (paediatric, pregnancy, geriatric)
- Revise and acquire complex trauma resuscitation knowledge and skills pertaining to; advanced trauma airway
 management, blunt and penetrating neck trauma, facial trauma, severe burns, traumatic cardiac arrest in rural
 and remote locations, severe thoracic trauma, junctional trauma and mass casualty incidents

paramedics. Priority is given to those working in the local region.
