The Great Southern region is located on the south coast of Western Australia, adjoining the Southern Ocean, where the coast extends for approximately 250 km.




Living and working in the region

Health services in the Great Southern are based across two health districts - Central Great Southern and Lower Great Southern. There are seven hospitals that are supported by a range of public and private primary healthcare services, general practitioners and

community-based health services.

Albany Health Campus

Albany Health Campus is the regional referral center for the region, servicing a population of approximately 78,000 people. The state-of-the-art, integrated facility offers a wide scope of services including emergency medicine, general medicine (including palliative care), general surgery, orthopaedics, oncology, obstetrics and gynaecology, paediatrics and psychiatry. The campus is also the location for the regional cancer centre.

Applying to WA Country Health Service

Intern applicants have the option to complete their internship in Albany by selecting WA Country Health Service (WACHS) as their Primary Employing Health Service (PEHS) via the WA Centralised Intern Recruitment Process. Applicants will be prompted to rank their preferred internship locations. Successful applicants receive a three-year contract with the ability to change WACHS location or PEHS at the completion of internship.

WA Country Health Service is a direct employer of RMOs at Albany Health Campus.

Applications for intern and RMO positions must be submitted via **MedCareersWA** through the Centralised Recruitment Process. In your application, clearly state your interest and suitability for a rural position. Selection and appointment will be based on merit.

Rotational opportunties

Intern applicants can express interest for rural rotations via their PEHS' term allocation process. Intern rotations to Albany Health Campus are available from Fiona Stanley Hospital.

Note: Allocation to rural terms is determined by the employing hospital's term allocation process.

Albany medical education and support

The Medical Education program at Albany Health Campus is developed and led by the Directors of Clinical Training (DCTs) and coordinated by the Medical Education Officer (MEO). The DCTs and MEO will support you during your rural training with supervision provided by your clinical supervisor. You can expect comprehensive education and training including clinical supervision, regular education sessions, orientation and assessment support, simulation training, and a range of professional development programs. As a junior doctor training at Albany, participation at scheduled educational sessions are strongly encouraged. Bedside teaching, Grand Rounds and inter-professional simulation-based training all form part of the educational program.
