


Living and working in the region

The Pilbara region incorporates two health districts – West and East Pilbara – with the majority of the region's population residing in the West. There is a range of different health services available throughout the Pilbara, with larger hospitals located in Newman, South Hedland and Karratha. The region is also home to a number of Aboriginal Medical Services that are based in Port Hedland, Roebourne and Newman.

Hedland Health Campus

Hedland Health Campus is the regional resource centre of the Pilbara with 24/7 consultant cover in obstetrics, anaesthetics, surgery, paediatrics and medicine, including a neo-natal special care nursery, a high dependency unit and on-site dialysis. There are up to 47 beds, supported by a range of inpatient and outpatient facilities and 13 Emergency Department bays.



Karratha Health Campus

Karratha Health Campus provides up to 40 beds and is supported by a range of inpatient and outpatient facilities. There are 15 Emergency Department bays along with four beds in the Short Stay Unit. Practitioners from a range of fields including emergency medicine, cardiology, plastic surgery and dermatology visit on a regular basis to care for communities in the West Pilbara. general surgery, paediatrics, obstetrics and gynaecology consultants are based in Karratha.

Rotations at WA Country Health Service

Applicants can express interest for WA Country Health Service (WACHS) rotations via their Primary Employing Health Service's term allocation process.
