The Wheatbelt surrounds the Perth metropolitan area. It is bordered by the Midwest, Goldfields, South West and Great Southern regions.

Living and working in the region


The Wheatbelt region covers four health districts: Coastal, Western, Southern and Eastern. There is a network of public and private health providers, including an integrated Aboriginal Health Service, which delivers a range of health services across the region.

Northam Health Service

Northam Health Service is the largest of four Integrated District Hospital Services in the Wheatbelt region. Located approximately 100km from Perth, the total population in the Northam Health Service catchment is approximately 44,000 people. The hospital has a 24-hour Emergency Department, a 38-bed medical ward, surgical services, cancer care, palliative care and a number of sub-acute and post-acute services.

Narrogin Health Service

Narrogin Health Service services a catchment area of approximately 20,000 people. The hospital provides an acute service consisting of a 24-hour Emergency Department, a nine-bed day surgery unit and a 36-bed combined inpatient ward with eight dedicated sub-acute beds. There are two birthing suites.
