The program aims to provide the successful candidate with relevant term rotations and professional development to help prepare them to apply for Basic Physician Training.

Applying for RAPTOR One in 2022

- Applicants must complete and submit an application via MedJobsWA.
- The doctor's CV and application will be assessed against the selection criteria by a selection panel. Interviews may be conducted.
- Please note: applicants are applying for entry into the RAPTOR program. Successful entry to the program will include employment with WACHS for the duration of the program.

Selection Criteria

- 1. Must hold unrestricted general registration with the Medical Board of Australia prior to commencement in the program.
- 2. Demonstrated clinical experience for a minimum of 12 months in a rural Western Australian Hospital employed by WACHS.
- 3. Demonstrated commitment to working in a rural setting, with a strong interest in pursuing a rural physician career.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with patients, families, carers, colleagues and others involved in health services to provide high quality health care.
- 5. Demonstrated participation in continuing medical education activities to maintain up to date knowledge and skills.
- 6. Demonstrated organisational and time management skills to provide safe and timely patient-centred care.
