Climate: In a word—perfect! Bunbury enjoys a coastal Mediterranean climate with warm summers and mild winters. The average maximum temperature in summer (Dec-Feb) is 27°C (cooler than Perth) and 16°C in winter (June-Aug).

Education: Bunbury has a variety of schooling options available to families with a huge selection of public and private primary and secondary schools, Christian and Catholic options, early learning and pre-primary schools. For tertiary education, there is a TAFE campus offering courses in a wide range of industry areas, as well as the Edith Cowan University (ECU) Bunbury campus.

Real estate: You will enjoy more affordable housing prices within Bunbury in comparison to other major cities across Australia. Coastal properties with waterfront views are an option to make the most of basing yourself in this stunning port city or nearby rural properties offering a tree-change lifestyle.
