

There are a range of different health services available throughout the Kimberley region, most of which are part of the public health system. The region is also home to a number of Aboriginal Medical Services that are mostly based in the region's major towns, with visiting services travelling out to smaller communities across the region.

As one of the remotest, wildest and most beautiful regions, the Kimberley is also home to a vast array of natural attractions including El Questro Wilderness Park; Purnululu National Park; Cable Beach; Lake Argyle; Buccaneer Archipelago; Fitzroy River; Windjana Gorge National Park; Cape Leveque; and the Gibb River Road. Be prepared as the Kimberley is one of the hottest parts of Australia, with incredible storms common during the wet season.

Broome Health Campus


Broome Health Campus is the regional hospital for the Kimberley, with a 59 bed ward it has a busy secondary referral Emergency Department, experiencing over 21,000 presentations each year and an active High Dependency Unit (HDU). Anaesthetic exposure and regional rotations to Derby and Kununurra may also form part of your Broome experience. The hospital is run by a dedicated, enthusiastic team of rural generalists who have extensive experience working in the Kimberley.

Broome Health Campus Medical Education and Support

The Medical Education program at Broome Health Campus is developed and led by the regional Director of Clinical Training (DCT) and coordinated by the Medical Education Officer (MEO). The DCT and MEO at Broome Health Campus will support you during your rural placement with supervision provided by your departmental clinical supervisor. You can expect comprehensive education and training including; clinical supervision, regular education sessions, orientation and assessment support, simulation training, and a range of professional development programs.



Supporting your move to Broome

The regional Medical Education Officer (MEO) is there to support your transition from city to country. Make early contact to confirm start dates and times, receive orientation information and discuss options and support for accommodation and transport to the Kimberley.

Applying to WA Country Health Service (WACHS)

Intern Positions at Broome Health Campus

Intern applicants have the option of selecting Broome Health Campus for their internship via MedJobsWA at https://medjobswa.mercury.com.au through the Centralised Intern Recruitment Process. Applicants can select WACHS as their Primary Employing Health Service, and then rank their preferred WACHS locations. Successful intern applicants receive a 3-year WACHS contract with the ability to move between WACHS locations at the completion of internship.

Rotational Opportunities

Applicants can express interest for rural rotations via MedJobsWA through the Centralised Intern Recruitment Process. Intern rotations to Broome Health Campus are available, for one or two terms, from Fiona Stanley Hospital. *Note: Allocation to rural terms is determined by the employing hospital's term allocation process.*

Applications for Intern and RMO positions must be submitted via MedJobsWA through the Centralised Recruitment Process. In your application, clearly state your interest and suitability for a rural position. Selection and appointment will be based on merit.
